Born and raised in Waialua, George Tanabe graduated from Willamette University (B.A.), Union Theological Seminary (M.Div.), and Columbia University (M.A. and Ph.D.). From 1977 to 2006, he taught in the Department of Religion at the University of Hawaii and retired as Professor Emeritus. He currently serves as president of BDK (Bukkyō Dendō Kyōkai) Hawaii and BDK America (Berkeley). His books about Japanese religions are published by university presses at Harvard, Princeton, and Columbia, and in-

clude Japanese Buddhist Temples of Hawai i (UH Press). In 2012, the Japanese government honored him with the Imperial Order of the Rising Sun. He still lives in Waialua.

Jeff Gere is among Hawaii's top storytellers. He created and produced Talk Story Festival, Hawaii's larg-



Pouring of Sweet Tea (Kanmoku)

This custom originally was practiced by the Brahmins. They used to pour perfumes or other sweet smelling liquids as blessing. Later, the Buddhists adopted this custom to be used at Hanamatsuri or Buddha Day celebration to bless the infant Buddha. A legend tells that a dragon came from heaven at the time of the birth of the Buddha and poured scented water on the infant Buddha. In China, this custom began about the 4th century. In Japan, it is recorded that the custom began about 606 A.D. Nowadays, the infant Buddha is placed in a flower shrine (Hanamido), and sweet tea is poured instead of scented water.

Ga kon kan moku Sho nyo rai

我今灌沐 諸如来 I shall pour sweet tea on the numerous Buddhas

Jo chi sho gon Ku doku ju

净智荘厳 功徳聚
The wonderful virtues and pure wisdom of the Buddhas

Go joku shu jo Ryo ri ku

五濁衆生 令離垢 Shall enable all sentient being to cast off their defilements

Do sho nyo rai Jo hos shin

同證如来 净法身 And, be awakened to the absolute mind of the Buddha.

Kei shu dai sho Bo gya bon

稽首大聖 簿伽梵 Thus, I bow in reverence to Shakyamuni Buddha.

Ten jo tenge Ryo zoku son

天上天下 両足尊
To the greatest and noblest among all men,

Ga tou kon i Ku doku sui

我等今以 功徳水

We now pour sweet tea of the greatest virtue.

Kan yoku nyo rai Jo hos shin

灌浴如来 净法身 And, extol the Buddha of absolute purity.
