

### THIS AND THAT IN 2025

Rev. Koji Jeff Ezaki Minister of Haleiwa Jodo Mission

- Obon is just around the corner. Compared to previous years, our Bon Festival this year will be late, held in August. The reason it is late is because we observe Toro Nagashi. Our Obon service is scheduled around the ocean tide. Between the months of July & August, we must pick the right day when the tide is lower around 9:00 pm and receding to the next morning. Otherwise, the toro may come back to the shore.
- Help is needed for our Bon Festival. Toro
  Nagashi has become very popular and many
  people have become interested in it in Hawaii.
  Helpers are needed to keep the event going.
  Your encouragement to your children,
  grandchildren, and friends will attract people to
  participate in the various activities leading up to
  the day of the event.
- I deeply appreciate the families who accepted the Tanagyo Obon house-visit. It is a custom for reverends to visit members' houses to pray at their butsudan home altar before Obon. In this age of texts, LINE, and other communication apps to stay in touch, it is a wonderful time for the sensei to visit members at their homes and talk to them face to face.
- My family will be in Japan from June 10th to 30th. They will be staying in Okayama, Tomomi's hometown, and in Osaka to see my parents. I will be with my dog, Mochi, at the temple. If you feel sorry for me, please bring bento or beer.
- I am surprised that not many people in Hawaii know that the World Expo 2025 is being held in Osaka from April to October. The last Osaka Expo was in 1970. My brother said he already went twice. If you are going to Japan, you should see it!
- I was assigned to Haleiwa Jodo Mission on November 1, 1998. Can you believe I have been here for 27 years! However, Rev. Miyamoto served for 30 years, and Rev. Shiratori served for 29 years at Haleiwa Jodo Mission. Did you know that Reverend Akiyama of Haleiwa Shingon Mission has served for 67 years. Awesome!! Compared to them, I am only a baby.
- I have posted over 70 bon dance movies on my YouTube channel. I personally film, edit, and post the movies on my channel. My main purpose of posting the videos is to preserve the teaching of our great teacher Shomida Sensei for future generations. Shomida Sensei was the last teacher to teach the traditional bon dance that nobody can replace in Hawaii.

- Some of you may be wondering if my bon dance, services, and music posts generate money from Google? My YouTube account is not monetized. Please feel free to watch the videos as I am not making any profit on them.
- The new elevator was installed. The old elevator was built around 1990. It was extremely rusted and had numerous problems because the temple is located right next to the ocean. The board decided to install the new elevator, costing over \$100,000.00. Those who love it, give them a LIKE!
- Thank you for the material donations to the North Shore Food Bank. Linda of the North Shore News holds food distributions twice a month: the second Wednesday at the Waialua Community Gym and the third Wednesday at Kaiaka Bay Park. Tomomi brings towels, blankets, and T-shirts that were donated by the members of Haleiwa Jodo Mission.
- I love all of you who support Haleiwa Jodo Mission. Do you know why I have been here as a sensei for 27 years? The answer is simple. BECAUSE OF YOU! If my family had not received your support, I would not be here today. I send tons of ALOHA to everyone.
