

HOKKAIDO SUMMER INSTITUTE

[Short-term study program] Hokkaido Summer Institute 2022

Hokkaido Summer Institute (HSI), one of the largest summer schools in Japan, is a program that brings together world-leading researchers with proven educational and research records, and provides educational courses in cooperation with the Hokkaido University (HU) faculty members. In 2022, more than 160 researchers from all over the world will gather at HU.

The medium of instruction at HSI is English. This provides international students with a stress-free learning environment without having to worry about language barriers, and also creates a special opportunity for Japanese students, who can participate in classes taught by internationally acclaimed researchers.

There will be over 270 courses (around 220 graduate courses and around 50 undergraduate courses) from June 1st to October 31st, 2022. Each course is worth 1 academic credit. Most of the courses run for one or two weeks. Students can tailor their own summer program by combining courses according to their major and interests.

From 2020, we also accept applications from non-students including working adults. More than 160 courses will be open to non-students this year. Online Application(1st) will be started in mid-March, 2022.

What kind of image do you have of studying in Japan?

A growing numbers of international students continue to embark on their journey to pursue higher education in Jopan. Ecnewin for high quality of education, Japaneso universities currently offer over 942 programmes taught fully in English (315 at undergraduate and 827 postgraduate levell. The opportunity to earn a degree without being a native Japanese specifor has made Japan a popular study destination for students attracted by its exotic culture, safety and surprisingly, affordable living expenses.

The number of students from Sub-Seharan Africa has exceeded 1,500 in May 2020 (*1). Most of whom are studying at graduate level in fields of Engineering, Social Science, Agriculture and Humanities. Among the abity-five Ugardana studying in Japan, is Mr. Busenya Mosea, who pursases Bachelor of Pharmacy at Hokkaido University-Japan, amazingly, in JAPANESE language.

He was awarded the Japanese Government MEXII'2) Scholarship, of which application is now open for Ugandams, administered by the Embasoy of Japan in Uganda. In the message below, he reflects on how he has continued to improve his global perspective with hopes of contributing to Uganda's development at heart. Message from Mr. Bukenya Moses

Currently I am in my final year pursuing a Bachelor of Pharmacy at the School of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Pharmacy, Holdaddo University. I neuroch about criticnal design of protein-like molecules (foldament) as mediummolecule drug candidates. I also train to become an all-round clinical pharmaclet. My current research has deepened my interest in proteins and nucleic acids and for that reason, I intend to pursue a Ph.D. in biologics drug sign upon graduation.

The reason why I choose Japan for my studies

During my first year as a pharmacy student (2013/14 Sept. intake) at Makerere University, Lattended a clinical research seminar and the guest speaker (clinical pharmacist) talked

about her involvement in early HTV/AIDS clinical trials which were funded by WHO. The test drug was an extract of a local herb but because of the limited capacity of the local pharmaceutical industry in the whole of East & Gentral Africa, manufacturing of the placebe and the test drug was outsourced to a Japanese pharmaceutical company

Having realized the gap in the local drug supply chain, I envisioned myself occupying the niche of manufacturing drugs tallored to the local population (given that most drug mees rich focuses on the needs of the demographics of OCEO countries). Since my program was clinical practice oriented, I realized that I needed a comprehensive pharmacy program that could cater for my drug discovery basic research needs.

Obsessed with the dream, I looked out for undergraduate scholarships for pharmacy programs in the biggest pharmacoutical industry players. Among them, Japan was much sales, enjoyed a higher standard of living as inferred from a higher life expectancy, and a relatively cheaper cost of living, Luckily, the Embassy of Japan in Uganda was shortlisting students for the Japanese Government MEXT Scholarship 2015, for which I applied and got accepted. After a one-year Japanese language proparatory education, I joined Hokkaido University to be mentered by leading scientists in my field of interest.

My image of Japan before arrival and current impression of Japan

The fact that Japan is the home to Toyota, the world's leading car maker, gave an impression that everyone had a car. But later I realized that the dependable efficient network of public transport system renders bioycles more popular than public triensport system renders bidycles more acquiter than cars. Also, the famous TV show called Ninja Warriers which used to be rebroadcasted by a local TV station depicted Japan as a country of a joyous daring young population and so I thought. Having lived in Japan be reserve years new. I concluded that Japan's mireadous success can be planed down to a delicate belance of 1) good governance, 2) an social structure based on legal equality and 3) adherence to cultural values. Actually, I think that the observed good conduct such as honesty, good time keeping or the extreme sense of accountability by people is nurtured by this fabric of cultural values.

The challenge and my ambition

Japan offered the most challenging yet exciting opportunity to explore beyond my own confort zone of a Westernized African heritage. The biggest challenge if scod was language barrier because I came to Japan when I could not even write my own name in Japanese. But thanks to support from instructors, within nine months I could procure most official and non-official procedures myself. Even when I had challenges, the education affairs office would help to liaise with the relevant authorities on my behalf.

I would like to encourage all prospective students not to be intimidated by the difficult facade of the Japanese language because once one gets immensed into the culture, they naturally matter the language. And it would enable you to bridge the gap between my country and the world's third bigged economic power. Also, in Japan foreign cultures are eciclosisted and the coexistence of adopted foreign ways of life and Japanese traditions signified a very tolerant society

By making this radical bold step to study in Japan, one gets a first hand experience of the fruit of a happy marriage of traditional values with advanced technology. Personally, I have come to embrace all cultural values of my country, Uganda, as enablers rather than impediments to socialpolitical and economic transformation of a country.



This office has just issuehed a Data Portal which: allows users to search their ideal programme according to major and degree one wish to study. [Scholarship] What is MEXT Scholarship "Undergraduate Students" Category

Some of you may know the name MEXT Scholarship as the term related with studying in Japan. MEXT stands for the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology-Japan, which offers Japanese government scholarship program. It is fully covered one including air-ticket and monthly stipend. You do not need to worry about your budget while studying in Japan, because this scholarship condition encourages you to concentrate on your study well. There are several categories in this scholarship; "College of Technology Students," Specialized Training College Students," "Undergraduate Students," and "Research Students."

Currently, 37 percent of Sub-Saharan African students in Japan are the recipients of this MEXT scholarship program (as of May 2020). Most of them are "Research Students" category, which is for pursuing Master or Doctoral degree. On the other hand, Sub-Saharan African recipients of "Undergraduate Students" category are very few. However, it does not mean there is no opportunities to get it. If you are really want to work in Japan after graduation, it would be nice to think of applying for this scholarship. Because "Undergraduate Students" category can give you one year intensive Japanese language course, which let you acquire great Japanese proficiency and start your undergraduate study in Japanese language. You will adapt many cultural things including the language skills during your undergraduate level, which might bring you next wonderful job opportunities in Japan.

It is easy to find the MEXT Scholarship programs administered by the Embassies of Japan. Normally, the application period opens late April for the admission of the very next year April. Just be aware that some Embassies of Japan does not receive applications of "Undergraduate Students." Therefore, please check well the website of the Embassy in your country. Our website also offers information on the MEXT Scholarship. Check here.

· American University-Ritsumeikan University Joint Degree Program(JDP) [April enrollment only]

Being the first joint degree undergraduate program between the US and Japan, together, Ritsumeikan University and American University cultivate globally minded leaders who can take active roles in fields such as international organizations, government, global business, media, and non-governmental organizations. Students study for 2 years in Japan and 2 years in the US.

· Global Studies Major (GS) [April & September enrollment]

The College of International Relations helps students acquire in-depth knowledge of international relations and become people of action in the international community.

Students also take courses systematically to acquire knowledge in different fields of international relations through three theme clusters; such as Peace and Governance; Development and Sustainability; and Culture and Society.

• Community and Regional Policy Studies Major (CRPS) [September enrollment]

Do you have any social issue to solve, or do you want to develop problem-solving skills? The Community and Regional Policy Studies Major (CRPS Major) trains students to be capable of designing and implementing policies to solve social problems and to play an important role in the world after graduation. Students also engage in practical training on implementing social surveys and field research.
