## Starting Monday, December 2, 2024, Additional Fees will be Charged for Emergency Services

**Ambulance Policy** 

If an ambulance is requested, the ambulance team will never refuse transportation.

## **Current State of Emergency Medical Services**

- The number of ambulance transports has reached highest record.
  - ► More than 60% of cases are concentrated in large hospitals with half of them being mild cases.
- April 2024 Labor reform for doctors began.
  - ► Emergency medical services are under strain.





This does not mean ambulance services will be charged!

In some hospitals, you will be charged additional fees only in the cases when the urgency to call an ambulance was deemed unnecessary.

★Examples of cases where there is clearly no urgency to call an ambulance:

①Only minor cuts ②Only minor scratches

\*Even if the symptoms are deemed minor upon examination, if the urgency to call an ambulance is recognized, no fee will be charged.

Ex. Heat stroke, febrile convulsions in children, epileptic seizures, etc.

## Reminder to All Residents

- 1 In the event of a life-threatening emergency, do not hesitate to call an ambulance.
- 2 If you are unsure whether to call an ambulance, call the emergency medical consultation helpline.
