It has already been 6 months since the fire, our temple structures—temple gate, bell tower, pagoda, temple, minister's residence, hall & pavilion, and rental cottages were all destroyed. Strangely almost nothing is left, not even enough ash to amount for the contents that were there. I was saddened and surprised that not even the bronze baby buddha statue, gongs, *kansho* (bell), incense burner remained.

Last month, when I visited our temple grounds, however, a ceramic Baby Buddha appeared in the ashes. The face of the Buddha statuette is so innocent, I am amazed this Baby Buddha survived such a severe fire. I brought the statuette back and have it enshrined in my room. It encourages me and gives me peace of mind, hope, and courage. I am truly grateful that this Baby Buddha survived the fire.
