

Bombus flavifrons

is native to North America, where it is distributed across much of Canada, Alaska, and the western United States.

This bee occurs at high altitude and latitude, living in habitat such as grasslands, prairies, tundra, taiga, and mountain forests and montane meadows. It feeds on a variety of flowers.

Nests built mostly underground, rarely on the ground surface. Queens camouflage entrance tunnels to their underground nests with grass or soil.
