
COMMUNITY WORK DAY

The issue of declining membership and the resulting stresses it causes was the focus of discussion within our group. The obvious aging and passing of many of our members over the years has created a void that is greatly missed. Innovative ideas were shared such as making the Mission more open to the community with different events such as yoga classes, farmers markets, flea markets, etc. were discussed. One activity that caught our attention was honoring veterans by a Big Island church. All ideas were good and should help. However, the biggest challenge in my opinion is to get not only get community involvement but somehow get more youth participation.

Meeting Overview by Valentina Watson

On September 17, 2022, the Statewide Laypersons and Fujinkai Committees held an informal convention via Zoom. Vashti Daise, Valentina Watson, and Setsuko Hara represented Lahaina Jodo Mission's Fujinkai. Edwin Sera and Lanny Daise represented the Mission's Laypersons. The meeting organizers Jocelyn Tengan and Iris Nitta of Kahului served as moderators.
