PUBLIC UPDATES FROM YAYOI

- Debris Removal began in mid-January, 200+ properties have been cleared.
- Option to have damaged trees that are slated to be removed, slabbed or chipped and left on your property.
- Properties in Wahikuli that are on cesspool can look into having their cesspool connection verified by a licensed engineer. If your cesspool was not damaged by fire, there is the opportunity to tie back into the original cesspool and build back sooner.
