MINISTER'S MESSAGE Rev. Gensho Hara

Dear Lahaina Ohana & Dharma friends,

Wishing everyone a peaceful Happy New Year! I hope that you are all in good health and find peace, embraced by the Great Compassion of Amida Buddha. On New Year's Eve, we celebrated in front of our *honzan* (main altar image), currently at Wailuku Jodo Mission. My heart was filled to see so many of our Lahaina members join and to enjoy *toshikoshi soba* and other New Year's dishes together. Our hearts were warmed by the hospitality of Wailuku Jodo Mission and their president Rodney Carillo and treasurer Lori in welcoming us at their temple.

I know that for many who are recovering from the August 8, 2023 fire, we are all still struggling and suffering. Although we face challenges daily, let us remember the teachings of our founder Honen Shonin "with undivided attention wholeheartedly call on Amida Buddha's name—whether walking, standing or lying down without doubt call Amida Buddha's name steadily, this is the practice of Amida's original vow (*hongan*)." Honen Shonin was awakened by this original vow. By calling Amida's name—*Namu Amida Butsu* we will be born into the Pure Land and embraced by the compassionate light of the Amida. With this conviction, Honen Shonin spread the nenbutsu teaching.

Last year marked the 850th year of the founding of Jodo Shu and the 130th year of Jodo Shu in Hawaii. Continuing this spirit, it is my hope to rebuild our temple in Lahaina for generations to come. Updates will be announced in our bulletin.

Our Jodo Shu founder Honen Shonin (1133–1212) passed on the twenty-fifth day of the first lunar month of 1212. With deep gratitude to our founder, who taught us the way to receive the compassion and wisdom of Amida Buddha through reciting nenbutsu, *Namu Amida Butsu*, we will observe *Gyoki-e*, his memorial service on <u>Sunday, January</u> 12 at 8:30 a.m. at Wailuku Jodo Mission.

We are now in the final phase of debris removal, soil sampling results have passed, and erosion control has been completed. Big mahalo to the US Army Corp of Engineers and the debris removal team which included sub-contractor Goodfellows, they took great care in clearing our temple property.

PAGODA URNS CLEANING

Under the guidance of UH Manoa art archivist Malia Van Heukelem and conservator Liane Naauao and with the support of National Heritage Responders Grant, we will be performing cleaning the temple family urns. We hope to identify the urns however please expect that not all the urns will be able to be identified. The cleaning will begin on **Saturday and Sunday, January 18–19, 2025**.

AMIDA BUDDHA RESTORATION

With the generous National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) Chair's grant for disaster recovery of \$30,000, we will be starting Phase I of the cleaning and restoration treatment of our Amida Buddha statue, which was saved from the temple by our Vietnamese nun friend Kim and former neighbor Ben Mora on the night of the Lahaina fires. The restoration team, led by conservator Prof. Naomi Sasaoka of Tohoku University and Buddhist historian Prof. Tomoko Moriya, be arriving from Japan and working on Phase I from Jan. 20 to 25 at Wailuku Jodo Mission. Mahalo to Maya who has been working diligently to secure the grants and finding the professionals to assist with the restoration effort.
