It was the densest dry haze in Europe since the late middle ages and it was mainly in the troposphere. It consisted of sulphuric acid aerosols and its overall mass amounted to about 200 megatons. The year 1816 went down in history as the "year without a summer".

The composition Dry Haze is the soundtrack to the shaded world, the twilight as it presented itself after big volcanic eruptions and might again be imminent if scientists' plans were put into practise.
