Ted Chaloner immigrated from Canada three times before finally becoming a US citizen. He founded and ran, for 35 years, an executive search firm based in Boston. When he decided to retire, Ted sold <u>chaloner.com</u> to a group that included one of his employees; the business has continued to grow and is now in New York, Dallas, Boston, Chicago and Washington DC.
