## JODO SHU PILGRIMAGE TOUR

In commemoration of the 850th Anniversary Celebration since the founding of Jodo Shu in 1175, the Hawaii Council of Jodo Missions is organizing a pilgrimage tour to Kyoto from October 5 to 6, 2023. The highlight of this trip is to participate in the commemorative service, sponsored by Jodo Shu, at the grand head temple Chion-in, which completed its renovation in 2020. Also, half-day conference and fellowship gathering with our former Hawaii ministers and members of Jodo Shu from other overseas districts are being planned. Those interested in staying longer, may also stay up to October 23.

## THE 850TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUNDED OF JODO SHU

In 2024, Jodo Shu celebrates 850 years since Honen Shonin (1133 –1212) founded our sect. Honen Shonin realized the way of Nenbutsu was the ultimate path for universal salvation after discovering the verse from the *Commentary on the Visualization Sutra* by the Chinese Pure Land Master Shandao, "All will be saved by calling Amida Buddha's sacred Name, Namu Amida Butsu." This happened in 1175 when Honen Shonin was forty-three years of age.

Since this spiritual encounter, Honen Shonin began disseminating the teachings of Nenbutsu at Yoshimizu in Kyoto, where the grand head temple Chion-in currently stands. Our founder's teachings have been passed for almost 850 years from generations to generations, and even now and into the future, we can continue to walk on the path of Nenbutsu, which would lead us all to the Pure Land.

Every fifty years, Jodo Shu has a major celebration for this commemoration and various projects are being planned for the approximately 7,000 Jodo Shu temples. The projects observed in

the year before the anniversary is called “Omachi-uke” (meaning “awaiting and preparing”). For this reason, several pre-events are planned in 2023, including the commemorative service at Chion-in in October – the very reason for our Pilgrimage tour to Kyoto.
