

Regulation 07-2024 Establishing a
**Capitular Mantle for the Order of the Eagle of Georgia
 and the Seamless Tunic of Our Lord Jesus Christ**

Approved by HRH Crown Prince Davit of Georgia on 02 May 2024

1. Mantle

The mantle of the OEG is composed of a crimson/burgundy cape or capitular mantle, opening centrally and secured by a golden clasp and chain. The Order's badge prominently appears on the wearer's left (viewer's right), while the interior is lined with white.

2. Collar

The collar, attached to the mantle, is also crimson/burgundy. Depending on the rank of the knight or dame, it may be plain or adorned with golden embroidered Georgian motifs. The embroidered collar is worn by those who:

1. Belong to the Royal House of Georgia or are recognized dynasts thereof; or

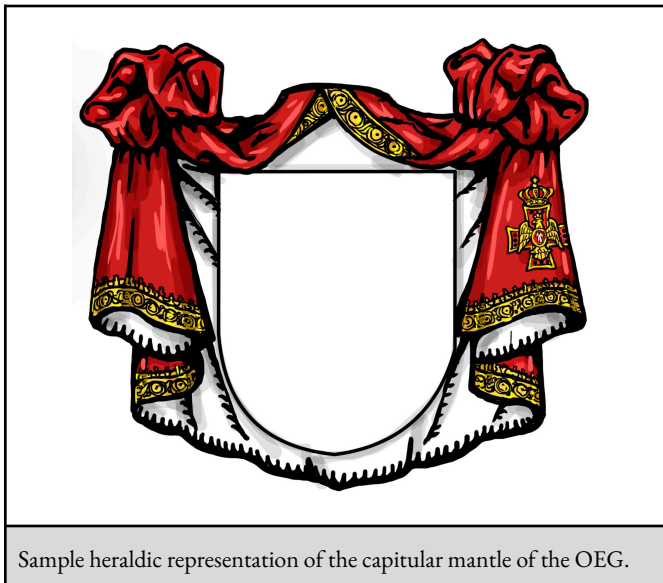
2. Hold a title of nobility recognized by the Head of the Royal House of Georgia; or
3. Possess nobility status (personal or hereditary) recognized by the Head of the Royal House of Georgia



The gold-embroidered motifs on the collars of titled nobles are inspired by historical Georgian examples. Designed by Deputy Herald Master Seán Brazeau, KEG, they enrich the collar's aesthetic appeal while honoring Georgia's cultural heritage and the lineage of its Royal House.

3. Heraldry

All confrères of the OEG may incorporate the Order's mantle onto their armorial bearings, alongside the corresponding insignia denoting their rank within the Order. A decorative golden frieze, either a plain fringe or a design embodying a Georgian motif, may be incorporated along the borders of the mantle as an artistic embellishment.
