

RECLAIMING TAPU AND MANA: RESTORING BALANCE AND HARMONY BETWEEN HUMAN BEINGS AND THE LAND

Join us on a transformative journey to explore the Māori indigenous concepts of Tapu, Mana and Mauri and their significance in restoring balance and harmony in our lives and the natural world.

Workshop Overview: In this workshop, we will delve into the principles of Tapu (sacred connection), Mana (intrinsic power) and Mauri (intrinsic energy) that relate to the relationship of all living things. We will examine what occurs when Tapu is not taken into account and explore practical ways to restore balance and enhance our connection to the natural world as composed of the 5 elements.

Key Topics - Understanding Tapu and its significance in Māori indigenous tradition- The interconnectedness of human beings and the natural world - The importance of restoring Tapu - Practical techniques for restoring balance and enhancing tapu, mana and mauri - Reclaiming ancestral and cultural identity.

Workshop Structure:

1st day:

Introduction, invocation, and teaching of key indigenous concepts

Knowledge sharing

Planning and preparation for ritual ceremonies

2nd day:

Site visits for hohorongo (restoration)

We will identify sites around Dresden where the land, people, and guardians are in need of restoration.
