
Bumblebees of the World

It is native to North America in the Pacific coastal states from British Columbia to California: the most common and widespread bumblebee in California and generally numerous in the Pacific states at lower elevations.

Their habitat is wide-ranging, including urban and agricultural areas.

B. vosnesenski has a very long flight season and can be found even in high winter.

This bumblebee nests in the ground, for example, in old gopher holes.
